

Carl Roosevelt Ammons, 94, of Carl Ammons Road, Franklin, passed away Wednesday, July 25, 2007, at his residence.

A native of Macon County, he was born March 8, 1913, to the late Lon and Candace Henry Ammons.

He served in the U.S. Army during WWII. He was a retired farmer, one of the first members of the Macon County Co-op, and a carpenter. He was a member of Clarks Chapel United Methodist Church.
