

Mrs. Anderson, Macon Native, Dies Thursday

Mrs. Sallie Collier Anderson, a Macon County native and widow of Maiden Anderson, died Thursday, October 3, at 11:15 p.m. in a Swain County hospital at the age of 81.

Formerly a Franklin resident, she had been living at Whittier for the past three months.

Funeral services for Mrs. Anderson were conducted on the 5th at 3 p.m. at the Maiden's Chapel Methodist Church, of which she was a member. Officiating were the Rev. J. C. Lane and the Rev. James M. Elliott, of Canton. Burial was in the church cemetery with Floyd Boyd, Roy J., and Bill Collier, James Farmer, and J. D. Collier serving as pallbearers.

Born Aug. 10, 1882, Mrs. Anderson was the daughter of the late William and Mrs. Mary Collier. She and Mr. Anderson, a Macon County native, were married in 1919. He died in 1923.

Surviving are a son, William Bynum Anderson, of Whittier; two step-sons, Harry Anderson, of Atlanta, Ga., and Vester Anderson, of Kannapolis; a step-daughter, Mrs. Dane Harding, of Macon, Ga.; four brothers, Will and Oscar Collier, of Franklin, Charlie Collier, of Gastonia, and Homer Collier, of Lowell; and two grandchildren.
