J. Lee Barnard, 68 year old Macon County native, died at his home last Friday. Death was caused by a heart attack.

The son of the late J. L. and Addie Ray Barnard, he was married to the former Miss Genevieve McKeldrey, of Andrews.

Mr. Barnard received his high school education at Gordon Military Academy and was a graduate of Georgia Technical Business College in Atlanta, Georgia.

A veteran of World War II; he was active in community affairs in Franklin. For many years he operated the old Barnard Grocery Store and was one of the last local ginseng dealers. He was active in the Democrat Party and served on the Macon County Board of Elections for 12 years. At the time of his death he was serving as Magistrate.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the First United Methodist Church, of which he was a member with Rev. Donald Haynes conducting the service and burial followed in the Woodlawn Cemetery.
