

Henry George Bartol, Jr., 66, husband of Mrs. Carol Erskine Bartol, of Erskine Road, Tryon, died Wednesday, August 21, at his home in Tryon, North Carolina after a brief illness.

He was a native of Flushing, New York, a son of the late Henry George and Hester Gouverneur Bartol.

Mr. Bartol attended St. Bernard School, St. Paul's School, and Harvard University. After a year spent around the globe, he was associated with the Clark Thread Company. He served as a Lt. Commander in the U.S. Navy in the Pacific Theatre during World War II aboard the Aircraft Carrier Ticonderoga and was decorated. The Bartols moved to Tryon following World War II. He owned and operated a Boys Camp near Hendersonville for several years and was then associated with Tryon Processing Company. In 1956, he became part-owner of Radio Station WTYN in Tryon, North Carolina. He also was part-owner of Radio Station WFSC in Franklin, North Carolina, and was a director of Mid-Carolina Telephone Company. He was long active in the Episcopal Church of the Holy Cross and served as vestryman and warden. He served as trustee and past president of the Tryon Fine Arts Center and was past

president and member of the Tryon Rotary Club. Mr. Bartol was a past president of Tobique Salmon Club, Quebec, Canada and a member of the Racquet and Tennis Club of New York City.

Funeral Services were held Friday at 11 a.m. at the Church of the Holy Cross with the Rev. Tracy H. Lamar officiating.
