

DEATH TAKES MRS. BINGHAM

**Macon Native Dies
Thursday At Home
In Patton Section**

Mrs. Ella Blaine Bingham, a native of this county and widow of Thomas Bingham, died last Thursday (October 18) at 7:30 a. m. at her home in the Patton Community.

Eighty-six years old, she had been in declining health for some time and was seriously ill for a month.
