

J. C. Blaine, Macon Native, Dies In Florida

James Canaro Blaine, a native of Macon County, died of a cerebral hemorrhage in Jacksonville, Fla., Sunday. It has been learned here.

Mr. Blaine, reared in the Cartoogechaye Community, attended school in Franklin and later was graduated from the University of North Carolina. For some thirty years, he had been manager of the Seminole Club in Jacksonville.

Funeral services were held in Jacksonville Tuesday.
