

**Charles B. Bolick
Passes In Florida;
Funeral In Franklin.**

The funeral of Charles B. Bolick, 55, native of the Ellijay section of Macon county, who died Sunday at his home at Lakeland, Fla., was held at 3 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at the Franklin Baptist church, with the Rev. J. F. Marchman, pastor, and the Rev. J. L. Stokes II, pastor of the Franklin Methodist church, officiating. Burial was in the Franklin cemetery.

Mr. Bolick, a son of the late Moody Bolick and Sarah Carpenter Bolick, was a graduate of Mars Hill college and the University of North Carolina, where he studied law. He was a former deputy sheriff of Macon county and for 23 years resided at Washington, D. C., where he was on the legal staff of the interior department, dealing with public lands. Ill health forced him to retire two years ago.

He was a member of the Knights of Pythias, the local Masonic lodge and the Lakeland First Baptist church. Franklin Masons served as pallbearers and had charge of the rites at the grave.

Surviving are the widow, the former Miss Ollie Sellers of Franklin, and a few cousins, among them being Miss Myrtle Bolick of Winston-Salem, Mrs. M. D. Edwards of Highlands and Miss Arietta Bolick of Franklin.
