

DEATH CLAIMS MOODY BOLICK

Well Known Higdonville Farmer Dies at Home Of His Birth

Funeral services for Moody Bolick, 76, prominent farmer of the Higdonville section who died at his home early Monday morning, were held at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning at the Holly Springs Baptist church. The Rev. J. M. Benson, supply pastor at the Franklin Baptist church in the absence of the Rev. E. R. Eller, conducted the rites.

Mr. Bolick, active in church work and community affairs, was well known throughout the county. He spent his entire life in the Higdonville section and died on the same farm upon which he was born.

Surviving Mr. Bolick are his widow, a son, C. B. Bolick of Washington, D. C., and a niece, Miss Myrtle Bolick.
