

Mrs. Bradley Macon Native, Dies In Georgia

Selma Ober Bradley, 48, wife of Herbie Bradley and a native of Macon County, died February 24 at her home in Rabun Gap, Ga., following an illness of two and a half months.

Services were conducted Friday at 2 p.m. at the Asbury Methodist Church, of which Mrs. Bradley was a member. Officiating were the Rev. Robert D. Collins, the Rev. Robert Poindexter, and the Rev. Pittman. Burial was in the church cemetery.
