

Death Claims Miss Brokaw; Rites Monday

Miss Eva Brokaw, sister of Mrs. St. Clair Anderson and aunt of Mrs. Carl P. Cabe, of Franklin, died at Angel hospital Sunday morning. Miss Brokaw, who had made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Anderson for the past year, had suffered a long illness, and had been critically ill at the hospital for six weeks. She was 67 years of age.

Funeral services were held at the Franklin Methodist church, of which she was a member, Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with the pastor, the Rev. C. E. Murray, officiating. Interment was in Woodlawn cemetery here.

Pallbearers were James Hausler, B. L. McGlumery, Harry Thomas, Edd Whitaker, Claude Bolton, and J. Ward Long. Members of Nequassa chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, were in charge of the flowers.

Born at Lincoln Park, N. J., September 28, 1883, Miss Brokaw had lived in Albany, N. Y., for 30 years, where, during that entire period, she was employed in the division of laboratory and research of the state health department. She made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Anderson until they moved here from Albany some years ago, and when she retired last year, Miss Brokaw joined them in Franklin.

She was a member of the First Methodist church of Albany until she moved here, when she transferred her membership to the Franklin church.

Survivors, in addition to Mrs. Anderson and Mrs. Cabe, include another niece, Mrs. L. L. Rice, of Dallas, Texas, who often has visited Mrs. Cabe here, and a number of nieces and nephews in New Jersey.
