

George E. Brown

George E. Brown, a native of Jackson County who had lived most of his life in Macon County, died Monday in a local hospital at the age of 81.

Mr. Brown, well known throughout the county, was a retired employe of the United States Forest Service and the Nantahala Power and Light Company.

He was a member of the Franklin Presbyterian Church where he had served as a deacon and an elder.
