

DEATH CLAIMS E. N. CABE AT HIS HOME

**Carpenter-Farmer
Was Macon Native;
Funeral On 8th**

Elbert Newton Cabe, 72, carpenter-farmer and native of this county, died September 6 at 7:10 a. m. at his home on Franklin, Route 2, following an illness of six months.

Funeral services for Mr. Cabe were conducted the afternoon of the 8th at Clark's Chapel Methodist Church, of which he was a member. Officiating were the Rev. R. L. Poindexter and the Rev. C. C. Welch. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Born July 14, 1886, he was the son of Lorange F. and Mrs. Margaret Ann Russell Cabe. He was married to Miss Margaret Rosalind Moore, of this county, in 1928. She died Sept. 17, 1952.
