

Former Employee Of The Press Killed

Mrs. S. J. Womack of Franklin received a message on Saturday afternoon from Hopewell, Va., stating that J. Henry Carlock, of Hopewell, formerly of Franklin, had been killed instantly when struck by a truck.

Mr. Carlock, who was a linotype operator on the Hopewell News, was killed on Saturday afternoon late, while enroute to his home from work. He was riding a bicycle and was struck by a truck driven by boys who were alleged to have been drinking.

Death was said to have been instantaneous.

Mr. Carlock, with his family, came to Franklin a number of years ago from Georgia, and was employed as linotype operator on the Franklin Press and Highlands Maconian, while Mrs. Carlock was telephone operator for Western Carolina Telephone Company.
