John Herman Carpenter, 60, of the Tennesse Community, died Monday, Sept. 13, in Angel Community Hospital, after a long illness. He was a native of Macon County, the son of the late Charles A. and Maymie Conley Carpenter, and was married to Jean Edmunds Carpenter, who survives. He was employed as an exhibit specialist for the F.B.I. in Washington, D.C., for 23 years and was retired. He was a World War II veteran of the U.S. Army.
