

# ONE DEAD IN BICYCLE WRECK

**Albert and Clarence Crane  
Of Highlands, Plunge  
Off Highway**

Albert Crane, 18, of Highlands, died Tuesday at Angel Clinic in Franklin as the result of a bicycle accident Saturday on the Highlands highway in which Clarence Crane, 16, was also seriously injured. The latter is reported by Dr. Furman Angel to be recovering.

The Crane boys were riding the bicycle down the mountain when they plunged over a high precipice and landed in the river below. They were not located until Monday about 2 p. m. when the father of Albert, who had been searching for his son, made a trip down the bed of the Cullasaja river. Clarence was found partly submerged in the water and Albert was lying on the rocks.

Albert Crane suffered a fractured skull and brain injuries; Clarence Crane's neck was broken.

Funeral services for Albert Linton Crane, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Crane of Highlands, were held at the Highlands Baptist church by the Rev. Oscar Nicks Wednesday afternoon, Oc-

tober 21, with burial in the church cemetery.

He was a member of the Baptist church and was born and raised in Highlands.

Surviving are his parents, five sisters, Lena, Ethel, Mary, Marie, and Katherine; and three brothers, Lawrence, Richard and Earl, all at home.
