

FUNERAL HELD FOR MRS. CRISP TUESDAY

Funeral services for Mrs. Elizabeth Phoebe Crisp, 75, who died at her home here last Sunday afternoon, were held at the Sugarfork Baptist church at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning. The Rev. J. G.
