

Dalrymple Dies Tuesday At Age 77

John Clayton Dalrymple, well-known farmer and native of this county, died Tuesday morning at the home of his son, William Dalrymple, on Franklin, Route 1. He was 77.

Funeral services for Mr. Dalrymple were conducted yesterday (Wednesday) at 11 a. m. at the Mount Hope Baptist Church by the Rev. W. L. Sorrells and the Rev. Arvil Swafford. Burial followed at the Mount Zion Cemetery.

Born October 25, 1886, he was the son of Thomas and Mrs. Amanda Kinsey Dalrymple. He was a member of the Mount Hope church and at the time of his death was one of the oldest deacons of the church. On November 10, 1898, Mr. Dalrymple was married to the former Miss Mary Lewis, who died 14 years ago.

Survivors include four sons, William, of Franklin, Route 1, Lyle, of Raleigh, Paul, of Asheville, and John Robert, of Dunn; a daughter, Mrs. Laura Belle Smith, of Raleigh; and nine grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
