

CLAIMS DUVALL, 81

Old-Fashioned Farmer Dies
at Home in Iotla
Funeral Services Tuesday

J. Byers Duvall, 81-year-old farmer of the Iotla section of Macon county, died at his home Tuesday morning at 6 o'clock following a four weeks' illness.
