Services Held Sunday For Wm. Duvall

Funeral services for William Duvall, 55, were held Sunday afternoon at the Oak Grove Baptist church, nine miles north of Franklin on the Franklin-Bryson City highway. The Rev. W. L. Bradley, Baptist minister of the Oak Grove community, was in charge. Interment was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Duvall died at Andrews Saturday morning at 4 o'clock following an illness of three weeks. Death was due to a heart ailment and complications.

Mr. Duvall, a native of Macon county, was the son of the late Luther and Elizabeth Russell Duvall. He was born March 12, 1884, and spent most of his life in Macon county. He was a farmer, but had for several months been working for the Nantahala Power and Light company at Calderwood, Tenn.

Surviving are his widow, the former Miss Minnie Guy, of Macon county; one daughter, Mrs. Frank Jacobs, of Dillsboro; two sons, Furman and Perry Duvall, of Almond; one grandchild; one sister, Mrs. Jane Hyde, of Emmett, Idaho, and one brother, Ernest Duvall, of Bayboro.
