

Pfc. George Dewey Elliott, son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter D. Elliott of route 4, died July 14 of wounds received in France on July 9, according to a message from the War Department. He was in a hospital in France.

Pfc. Elliott entered service in April 1942 as a volunteer and was stationed at Fort Bragg, Camp Wolters, Camp Barkley, Texas, Camp Granite, Calif., and Fort Dix, N. J., before going overseas in March of this year. He also took part in Louisiana maneuvers.

He was a member of Holly Springs Baptist church and active in all church affairs.

Survivors include his parents, two brothers, Theodore of Washington State and Junior of route four; six sisters, Mrs. routeington State and Junior of route four; six sisters, Mrs. Lefferts Higdon and Mrs. Chas Williams of route 4, Mrs. Leonard Corbin, Emma, Pauline and Dewell, all of Asheville.
