

## DEATH CLAIMS MRS. ELLIOTT

Well Known Highlands  
Woman Dies at Home  
on Satulah

The funeral services of Mrs. John Barnwell Elliott, who died at her home in Highlands last Thursday morning at 4 o'clock, at the age of 81, were held in All Saints Chapel of the University of the South, Sewanee, Tenn., on Friday afternoon, October 9. The service was read by the Rev. Moultrie Cigerry, chaplain, and the Rev. Haskell Dohose, D. D., of the Theological school of the university. Dr. Ben Finney, vice-Chancellor of the university, and Telfair Hodgson were pallbearers.

### From Charleston

Mrs. Elliott was before her marriage Miss Lucy Huger, daughter of Dr. Joseph Alston Huger, a rice planter of Charleston, S. C., and was married immediately after the war between the states to Dr. Elliott, son of Bishop Stephen Elliott, of Georgia, who served throughout the war as 1st lieutenant in the C. S. A.

The lives of Dr. and Mrs. Elliott were closely associated with the early history of the University of the South. Dr. Elliott was one of the first seven professors to open the university after the war in order to hold the franchise of 10,000 acres on the Sewanee mountain top given by the state of Tennessee to Bishops Polk, Otey and Elliott for a church university, which was opened with 12 students in log cabins for class rooms. Dr. Elliott carried his bride up the mountain in the tender of an engine.

After a residence of 18 years at Sewanee the Elliotts removed to New Orleans where Dr. Elliott filled the chair of medicine in Tulane University for 25 years. Upon Dr. Elliott's retirement, the family made their residence at Highlands, where for many years they had spent the summers. Here in their beautiful home on the slopes of Satulah mountain, Dr. and Mrs. Elliott spent their old age, finding happiness in the beauty of the mountains and love in the hearts of their neighbors. Dr. Elliott died about 10 years ago.

Mrs. Elliott is survived by four sons and three daughters; Dr. John Barnwell Elliott of New Orleans; Huger Elliott, of the Metropolitan Museum, New York City; Joseph Huger Elliott of Flat Rock; Percival Elliott, Washington, D. C.; Misses Charlotte Barnwell Elliott and Esther Huger Elliott of Highlands; Mrs. W. W. Cunningham of Scarsdale, N. Y.; a grandson, Douglas Elliott, of Birmingham, Ala.; three sisters, Mrs. Octavius Theodore Porcher, and the Misses Katherine Mackay and Mary Esther Huger.
