

DEATH CLAIMS MRS. ELMORE

Swain Native Dies
In Hospital; Rites
Held At Liberty

Mrs. Callie Elizabeth Lakey Elmore, widow of Jim Elmore, died May 2 at 2:30 p.m. at Angel Hospital following an illness of six weeks.

Eighty years old, she was a native of Swain County, but had lived in Macon County for 70 years, and in Franklin for the past 30.

Funeral services were conducted the morning of the 4th at the Liberty Baptist Church, by the Rev. Paul Sorrells and the Rev. Andrew Cloer. Burial was in the church cemetery.
