

Mrs. Elmore, Maconian, Dies At 36

Mrs. Ruht Beryl Moffitt Elmore, a Macon native who had been living in Albany, Ga., for four years, died December 24 at St. Mary's Hospital in Rochester, Minn., following a short illness.

Funeral services for Mrs. Elmore, 36, were held on the 28th at the Wolf's Grove Baptist Church, of which she was a member. Officiating were the Rev. Melvin Brooks, pastor, the Rev. Bill Shields, and the Rev. R. L. Pordexter. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Born May 12, 1922, she was the daughter of Mack B. and Mrs. Blanche Blaine Moffitt, of Franklin, Route 2. She was married to Nelson F. Elmore, who survives, in DeKalb County, Ga., in January, 1941. Mrs. Moffitt was active in church affairs.
