Passes Tuesday Night After Long Illness

Mrs. Ella Elizabeth Emory, 52, died Tuesday night, April 4, at 9 o'clock at Angel hospital. Death was caused by heart complications from which she had suffered for five years.

Mrs. Emory was before her marriage Miss Ella Elizabeth Anderson, daughter of John and Mary C. Anderson, of the Cartoogechaye section, and had spent all of her life in Macon county.
