

# A. J. EVANS, 84, TAKEN BY DEATH

## Rites For Cullasaja Farmer Conducted At Sugarfork

Andrew J. Evans, a resident of the Cullasaja community, died last Thursday afternoon at his home at the age of 84.

Funeral services were held Saturday at 10 a. m. at the Sugarfork Baptist church, with the Rev. James I. Vinson and the Rev. Frank Reed officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Evans, a native of Tennessee, came to Macon County at the age of 18 and was engaged in farming and mining. He served as a deacon of the Pine Grove Baptist church. He was married in 1890 to Miss Mildred Peek, of this county, who died in 1945.

Born March 24, 1866, in Etowah, Tenn., he was the son of Samuel and Mrs. Catherine Younce Evans.
