

# MRS. EVANS DIES AT 86 AT AQUONE

Buncombe Native Has  
96 Descendants; Rites  
Held On Saturday

Mrs. Ellen Haney Evans, wife of Joseph S. Evans, of Aquone, died last Thursday at 4:50 p. m. at the home of a son, Sheridan Evans, at Aquone, following an illness of several months.

Eighty-six years old, she has 96 descendants — four sons, four daughters, 45 grandchildren, and 43 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Mrs. Evans were conducted Saturday at 10 a. m. at the Aquone Baptist Church by the Rev. Theodore Denny. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Born in Buncombe County October 14, 1869, Mrs. Evans was the daughter of Dave and Mrs. Elizabeth Ledford Haney. She was a member of the Church of God, Belmont, and was married to Mr. Evans in 1889.
