

## Mrs. R. L. Foreman

### Passes; Long Time Summer Resident Of Highlands

The death of Mrs. Robert Langdon Foreman in an Atlanta hospital on January 4, removes from Highlands another of its long-time summer residents. Mrs. Foreman, the former Miss Effie Howell, was the eldest daughter of Evan P. Howell, first editor of the Atlanta Constitution, and an aunt of the present publisher of that paper. She was in her seventy-second year and had been ill for some time.

The names of Mr. and Mrs. Foreman, as well as that of her son, Dr. Clark Foreman, are listed among the founders of Highlands Museum of Natural History, and it is largely due to the efforts of Dr. Foreman, member of the board of trustees and first president of that institution, that Highlands has one of the most modern museum buildings in the south. In addition to Dr. Clark Foreman, surviving sons include Howell, Robert L., Jr., and Lauren Foreman.

The Foreman home here is located on a knoll just off the Horse Cove Road, overlooking beautiful Ravenel Lake and the Biological Laboratory. Mrs. Foreman's sister, Miss Rostie Howell, a niece, Miss Louise Cramer, and a sister-in-law, Mrs. Clark Howell, all have summer homes at Highlands Country Club.
