

## **MSgt. Fowler**

Master Sergeant Lee Fowler, 81, died Monday, Sept. 28 at a hospice in Savannah, Ga.

A native of Franklin, he was retired from the Air Force with more than 20 years as an administrative supervisor. He received the following Bronze Battle Stars: Air Combat-Balkans, Germany, Rome-Arno, Southern France, North Appennines and Po Valley. He was part of the original group at Hunter Army Air Field in 1940. He served with the U.S. Embassy in both the Philippines and London.

After retiring from the Air Force, he worked at Candler Hospital in the Preventive

Maintenance Department. He was a member of White Bluff United Methodist Church, the Men's Club, Clinton Lodge 54, F&AM, the Scottish Rite Consistory-Valley of Savannah and the Patrol Unit of Alee Shrine Temple.

He is survived by his wife, Betty Louise Rogers Fowler of Savannah; a son, Jerry Lee Fowler of Savannah; a half-brother, J.L. Smith of Rock Hill, S.C.; a granddaughter, and several nieces and nephews.
