

## Lewis Franks Dies From Injuries In Auto Crash

Lewis Franks, 20, of Highlands, died at the Angel clinic here on Tuesday evening, Nov. 7 at 8:30 o'clock, as results from injuries of the chest, kidney and pelvis received on Monday night when the Chevrolet car he was driving, ran into guard posts on the highway about three miles out the Franklin-Highlands highway.

Young Franks, who was the driver of the car, was driving at a rapid speed and in failing to make the deep curve, ran into the guard posts and knocked them down for about 100 yards. He was accompanied by Gordon Barnes, of Buck Creek, who only received minor bruises and lacerations, and a Miss Davis who was not injured.

Funeral services were held on Thursday morning, Nov 9, at 11 o'clock at Buck Creek Baptist church, with Rev. Oscar Nix, officiating. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Franks, who was born on August 29, 1924, is the son of Lewis and Belle Barnes Franks, of Highlands. He had been working in Flint, Mich.

Surviving are are the parents and four brothers, Orvel, of Fontana, Canary, Edward and Vernon Franks, all of Highlands and four sisters, Mrs. Wylma Stewart, Franklin; Geneva, Lella and Juanita Franks also of Highlands. Also the grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Garrett Franks and Mr. and Mrs. Will Barnes, all of Buck Creek.
