

## S. C. Franks, Maconian, Dies In S. C.

Samuel C. Franks, Sr., a Macon County native who had lived in Anderson, S. C., since 1911, died March 12 at Iva, S. C., Route 3, following an illness of a week. Eighty-two, he had been in declining health for several years.

Funeral services for Mr. Franks, a retired farmer, were held the 15th at the McDougald Chapel there. Burial was in Silver Brook Cemetery.

Born April 22, 1875, he was the son of William J. and Mrs. Mary Hampton Franks. He was twice married, first to Miss Ella Kinsland, who died in 1914, and then to Miss-Margaret Irby, who survives.
