

Roe C. Garland, 23, Dies Sunday On Upper Tesenta

Roe C. Garland, 23, died at his home in the Upper Tesenta section, about 15 miles southeast of Franklin, Sunday night about 8:30 o'clock, following an illness of more than two months. Death was caused from tuberculosis of the throat.

Mr. Garland, a son of George L. Garland and the late Mrs. Nina Talley Garland, was born on December 16, 1916 and lived all of his life in his home community. He was engaged in farming.

Funeral services were held on Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock at Dryman Chapel Baptist church on Tesenta. The Rev. James I. Vinson, a Baptist minister of Dillard, Ga., Route 1, was in charge of the services. Interment was in the church cemetery.

Besides his father, Mr. Garland is survived by one sister, Miss Allie Belle Garland.
