

# CHAS. L. GARNER DIES SUDDENLY

Succumbs To A Stroke:  
Last Rites On  
Tuesday

Charles L. Garner, 73, farmer, died of a heart attack at his home Monday morning. Mr. Garner apparently was in good health Monday morning when he went to the barn to feed his livestock. A short time later he suffered the heart attack and lived for only a few minutes.

He was a native of Tennessee, but resided in North Carolina most of his life. He moved to Macon county 35 years ago. He was married to the former Miss Florence Ann Crawford of Haywood county, who survives him.

The body was taken from the Bryant funeral home to the Franklin Baptist church, of which he was a member, Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Funeral services were held there at 3 o'clock, with the Rev. J. E. Marchman and the Rev. Mr. Buchanan officiating. Burial was in Franklin cemetery.
