

Pfc. DANIEL GARRETT

Pfc. Daniel Garrett, twenty-two-year-old son of Mrs. Elsie Clark of Oak Dale, was killed in action in Holland on September 18, according to a message received here.

Pfc. Garrett, who was serving in a glider infantry unit, entered the army in 1942. He went overseas in July, 1943. He received his training at Camp Clairbourne and Fort Bragg.

He had been previously wounded in June and stayed in a hospital for several weeks. He went back into service in September after a short leave in England.

Mrs. Clark had received a letter about two weeks ago.

Before entering the service, he had been in a CCC camp for two and one-half years.

Surviving besides the mother, are the step-father, Oscar Clark, of Oak Grove; one sister, Mrs. W. L. Keel, of Alliance; and one brother, Bm. 2/c Arthur V. Garrett, serving in Panama for the past year. He was the son of the late Ralph Garrett of Swain county.
