

## Mrs. Andrew Gennett Passes At Asheville Home

Mrs. Andrew Gennett, a former resident of Franklin, died suddenly last Thursday morning at her home in Asheville, and funeral services were held on Saturday at 3 o'clock at the home, with the Rev. W. A. Lambeth of the First Methodist church, officiating.

Mrs. Gennett, who was prominent in civic and social circles in Asheville, was the widow of the late Andrew Gennett, prominent lumberman. After residing for six years in Franklin, Mr. Gennett, who died in October 1941, moved to Asheville and with his brother, Nat Gennett, founded the Gennett Lumber company. Mrs. Gennett was the daughter of the late Congressman Farish Carter and Mrs. Tate of Jasper, Tenn. She attended Brenau college, and Mary Baldwin college in Staunton, Va.

The survivors include one daughter, Miss Julia Gennett, student at Duke University, two sons, Carter Tate Gennett of Asheville and Lieut. Andrew Gennett, stationed at the naval air station, Dallas, Texas, one sister, Miss Virginia Tate, and two grandchildren, Katherine Pearce and Ann Stone Gennett.
