

# MRS. GIBSON DIES SUNDAY IN HOSPITAL

Was Macon Native,  
Former Teacher;  
Rites On Tuesday

Mrs. Frances Parrish Gibson, 63, wife of Weaver Gibson, of the Cowee community, died Sunday at Angel Hospital after an illness of six months.

A native of this county, Mrs. Gibson was a former school teacher and a member of the Liberty Home Demonstration Club.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at 2 p.m. at the Snow Hill Methodist Church by the Rev. R. J. Hahn, pastor, and the Rev. E. O. Altland, pastor of the Iotla Baptist Church. Burial was in the church cemetery.
