Henry Gibson, Native Of County, Dies At 82

Henry Gibson, farmer of Route 5 and a native of this county, died November 13 at his home following an illness of three years. He was 83.

Funeral services for Mr. Gibson were conducted the 16th at 3 p.m. at the Sugarfork Baptist Church, of which he was a member, by the Rev. Earl Dendy, the Rev. Gene Southard, and the Rev. L. E. Angel. Burial was in the church cemetery with Frank Gibson, Grover Sorrells, Branson Barrett, Lex Gibson, Vernon Deal, and Carl Angel serving as pallbearers.

Born Sept. 12, 1880, he was the son of the late Herman and Mrs. Rhoda Gibson. He was once Sunday school superintendent of his church and was married to Miss Addie Sorrells, of Towns County, Ga., who died in

1932.
