## James Goode, Publisher, — Dies Saturday In Hospital —

James S. (Jim) Goode, publisher of the Highlands Episcopal Church of THE HIGHLANDER in Highlands and an active booster of Western North Carolina, died Saturday at 9 a.m. in an Asheville hospital.

Fifty-two years old, Mr. Goode was in excellent spirits Thursday while attending to some last minute details of his newspaper, which is printed in Franklin. He later became ill at his home in Highlands, was taken to Highlands Community Hospital, and then transferred to the Asheville hospital.

A native of Morganton, he also published Picturesque Magazine and was treasurer of the Highlands Chamber of Commerce. He was a vestryman and secretary

of the Incarnation. Active in town affairs since starting THE HIGHLANDER here last year, he just recently was named to the town's planning committee. Mr. Goode published a newspaper some 25 years ago in Waynesville. He was the son of the late Dr. W. O. Goode, a Methodist minister of
