

Philip L. Gravely

Philip L. Gravely, 32, a resident of Franklin for the past 10 years and a native of Brevard, died Monday afternoon near Highlands of apparently self-inflicted gun shot wounds.

Mr. Gravely served four years in the U. S. Air Force and later as a highway patrolman from 1960 to 1967. Since then, he had been an owner and operator of a restaurant in Franklin.

Surviving are the widow, Mrs. Hazel McCall Gravely; the parents, Lewis D. and Gladys Mull Gravely of Brevard, Route 1; a daughter, Lora Rae Gravely, of the home; two brothers, Jerry R. and Denton Gravely, both of Brevard, Route 1.

Services were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Dunn's Rock Baptist Church of Brevard, of which he was a member.

The Revs. Kermit Reece and Kadez Wilde officiated. Burial was in the church cemetery.

The body remained at Neal and Potts Funeral Home until placed in the church an hour prior to the services.
