

George Guest Dies Monday In Michigan

George H. Guest, 71-year-old Macon native and farmer, died Monday at 9 a. m. at the home of a son, Jack Guest, in Detroit, Mich.

Mr. Guest, a familiar figure in Franklin as he made his rounds collecting scrap paper and cardboard for resale, had been living with his son since December. He had been in declining health for some time.

Funeral services are set today (Thursday) at 2 p. m. at the Holly Springs Baptist Church, of which he was a member. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

The son of Coley and Mrs. Addie Gribble Guest, he was born May 24, 1883. On April 1, 1901, he was married to Miss Martha Kinsland, of Franklin, who died in 1944.

Surviving are five sons, Jack, of Detroit, Coley, of Franklin, Route 4, Frank L., Carl, and Richard, also of Detroit; three daughters, Mrs. Gordie Guest, of Franklin, Route 4, Mrs. Grady Gregory, of Franklin, Route 5, and Mrs. Gladys Gibson, of Detroit; three brothers, Fred Guest, of Roanoke Rapids, Charles Guest, of Danville, and James Guest, of Franklin, Route 4; a sister, Mrs. Mary Yeamons, of Danville; 20 grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.
