

Earl Edward Guyaux

Earl Edward Guyaux, 86, of Salisbury, formerly of Otto, passed away Thursday, June 19, 2008, at his residence.

Born on July 20, 1921, in Turtle Creek, Pa., he was the son of the late Edward Parker Guyaux and Anne McIntyre Guyaux.

He graduated from the Turtle Creek School system and attended the University of Miami. A veteran of the U.S. Navy, Mr. Guyaux served his country during WWII and the Korean War.

Mr. Guyaux was a distribution supervisor with Florida Power & Light Company until his retirement. He owned and operated a kennel in Otto, and was a member of the Scottish Rite, a 32nd-degree Mason. He also was a volunteer with Rowan Helping Ministries.
