

ANOTHER GRAY VETERAN DIES

Funeral Services Held for Rufe H. Hall, 93, Of Etna

Funeral services for Rufe H. Hall, 93, a Confederate veteran, were held at 11 o'clock Saturday morning in the Oak Grove Baptist church at Etna. The Rev. A. S. Solesbee officiated.

Mr. Hall died last Thursday afternoon at his home in Etna after a short illness from influenza. A native of Macon county, he had resided here all his life. He was a well-known farmer, and a member of the Oak Grove church. During the War Between the States he served in Company A of the 65th N. C. regiment.

Three sons and one daughter survive by his first marriage, which was to Miss Lucy Morrison. They are: Elbert and Dee Hall, of Warren, N. C.; Doc, of Etna; Mrs. Laura Shaw, of Spokane, Wash.

Later Mr. Hall married Miss Maggie Slagle. By this marriage three daughters survive: Mrs. Ben Matlock, of Boise, Idaho; Mrs. Maude Wells, of the state of Washington; and Mrs. Hattie Williams, Etna. Sixty grandchildren, a number of great-grandchildren, and three great-great-grandchildren survive.
