

Robert Caine Halter, 45, of Greenville, S.C., died Friday, Aug. 10, 2007, at his home after battling lung cancer.

He was born Aug. 23, 1961, in Greenville to Frank Bradbury and Shirley Caine Halter. He graduated from Christ Church Episcopal School and the University of Georgia, where he was a member of Kappa Alpha fraternity. He was president of Coldwell Banker Caine Commercial.

He excelled in athletics throughout his life and recently was advised he would be inducted into the Christ Church Episcopal School Sport Hall of Fame in October. He served on the senior committee of the Greenville Cotillion Club. He was past officer of the Poinsett Club and an active member of Greenville Country Club.

He was the third generation executive of the company founded by his grandfather, Bubba Caine. He was recognized as a Certified Commercial Investment Member. He was a member of the International Council of Shopping Centers, the Urban Land Institute and a past member of the Coldwell Banker Commercial National Advisory Board. He served in the past as vice chairman of the Zoning Board of Adjustment and Appeals for Greenville, president of the Multiple Listing Service and president of the South Carolina CCIM Chapter. He served as president of the Greater Greenville Association of Realtors and was named the first Commercial Realtor of the Year. He served as chairman of the YMCA of Greenville Metro Board of Directors and chairman of the YMCA Cleveland Street Campaign to completely renovate the facility. He also served as a board member of the Community Foundation. He was an active communicant of Christ Episcopal Church. A long time usher, he also coached the youth church basketball team.

He enjoyed spending time with family and friends at homes in Pawleys Island, S.C., and Lake Rabun. He was an avid Georgia fan and served as president of the Greenville chapter of the Georgia Bulldog Club.

Survivors include: his wife of 21 years, Laurie Porter Halter of Greenville; a son, Caine Halter Jr. of Greenville; a daughter, Page Halter of Greenville; his father, Frank B. Halter of Greenville; two sisters and brothers-in-law, Deborah H. and Mike Bell of Greenville and Laura H. and Nick Sardone of New York; a brother and sister-in-law, Frank B. "Brad" Halter Jr., and Sharon Halter of Greenville; his mother-in-law, Muriel J. Porter of Greenville; his father-in-law, Cordell Porter of Greenville; a brother-in-law Dell Porter and wife Lisa of Easley; and six nieces and nephews.

Funeral services were held Sunday at Christ Episcopal Church with the Rev Robert F. Dannals officiating. Burial followed in the churchyard.
