

Miss Amy Harrison, a Macon County native and retired school teacher, died Wednesday, February 17, at 8 p.m. in a Burke County hospital. She had been in declining health for several years.

Miss Harrison spent most of her teaching career in South Carolina. A member of a pioneer Macon County family, she belonged to the Eastern Star and had been a member of the Franklin Methodist Church since early childhood. She was a daughter of the late John O. and Mrs. Allie Nolen Harrison.
