

FATALLY SHOT WHILE HUNTING

Riley Headen, 18, Is Victim of Accidental Gun Discharge

Riley Headen, 18, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Headen, of Walnut Creek, died in Angel Brothers' hospital at 8:30 o'clock Sunday morning, as the result of the accidental discharge of a 12-gauge shot gun while out squirrel hunting Saturday afternoon, near his home.

He was accompanied hunting by his brother, Elbert. It was reported that as he set the gun down the trigger caught on something and the weapon was discharged. The load of No. 4 shot took effect in Headen's stomach. Headen is survived by his parents, three sisters and 11 brothers. Funeral services were held Monday.
