

### Macon Native Was 51; Services Held Monday Afternoon

Mrs. Elizabeth Barnard Hearn, a native of Macon County, died Sunday at 1 p. m. at the home of her sister, Mrs. Grace O'mohundro, in Franklin. Fifty-one years old, she had been in declining health.

Mrs. Hearn just recently returned here from Rockville, Md., where she had been living since 1955. She had been a Civil Service employe for 15 years.
