

F. C. Henderson Dies October 9 In Washington

Fred C. Henderson, a Maconian who moved to Alger, Wash. in 1938, died October 9 in a hospital in Sedro Woolley, Wash., at the age of 85.

He was a native of Transylvania County and was the son of the late Charles and Mrs. Mollie Aiken Henderson. While living here, Mr. Henderson was a member of the Gillespie Chapel Methodist Church.

Funeral services were held the 11th in Burlington, Wash.

Mr. Henderson was twice married, first in October, 1895, to Miss Allie Hopper, of Dillard, Ga., who died March 3, 1910; then, on Dec. 9, 1911, to Miss Annie Watts, of this county, who survives.

A son and four daughters survive by the first marriage, Alex Henderson, of Sedro Woolley, and Mrs. Exie Dills, of Dillard, Ga., Mrs. Margaret Martin, of Sumas, Wash., Mrs. Mollie Simmons, of Gastonia, and Mrs. Emily Gilreath, of Cherryville. Three daughters and three sons survive by the second. They are Mrs. Ruth Angel, of Mt. Vernon, Wash., Mrs. Obie Lewis, of Sedro Woolley, and Mrs. Charlotte Dahl, of Allen, Wash., and Boyd Henderson, of Edison, Wash., Charles Henderson, of Bow, Wash., and Thad Henderson, of Alger, Wash. Also surviving are 41 grandchildren; 30 great-grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. Fannie Hopper, of Highlands and Mrs. Helen Waldroop, of Franklin; two brothers, F. J. Henderson, of Franklin, and Weitzel Henderson, of Oklahoma City, Okla.; and several nieces and nephews.
