

Alex W. Higdon Dies Tuesday At His Home

Alex Weaver Higdon, 66, former textile worker and state highway employe, died Tuesday at 4:55 a.m. at his home in the Higdonville community (Route 5) after an illness of a year.

A Macon County native, he had worked in a textile plant in Georgia 12 years, for Van Raffle in Franklin nine years, and at one time, was employed by the state highway department.

Funeral services are scheduled today (Thursday) at 2:30 p.m. at the Sigafook Baptist Church. Officiating will be the Rev. Jarvis Underwood, pastor, the Rev. Paul Sorrells, and the Rev. W. I. Sorrells. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Born June 25, 1892, Mr. Higdon was the son of Sam and Mrs. Harriett Berry Higdon. He was a member of the Higdonville Bap-

tist Church and was married May 13, 1917, to Miss Carrie Myrtle Bryson, of this county, who survives.

Also surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Earl Finney and Mrs. Blair (Pete) Price, both of Franklin, Route 5; two brothers, Parker Higdon, of Route 5, and Ferdie Higdon, of Franklin; two sisters, Mrs. Charlie Crawford, of Route 5, and Mrs. Sam J. Murray, of Franklin; and five grandchildren.

The body will remain at the home until time to be taken to the church to lie in state 30 minutes prior to the services.

Pallbearers will be Grayson Lefferts, and L. H. Higdon, Bill Raby, and William G. and E. G. Crawford.
