

E. B. HODGINS DIES SUNDAY AT HIS HOME

**Was Farmer And
Native Maconian;
Survivors Given**

Edward Bascomb Hodgins, 67, farmer and native of this county, died Sunday about 1 a. m. at his home on Franklin, Route 2.

Funeral services were conducted at the Black Mountain Baptist Church at 2 p. m. by the Rev. Robert Bates and the Rev. Claude Ledford. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Mr. Hodgins was born February 17, 1889, the son of Columbus and Mrs. Maggie Ledford Hodgins. He was a member of the Black Mountain church and in 1910 was married to Miss Flora McClure, who survives.
