

## Veteran Retiree Passes Here

Charles Otto Hoffmeyer, 73, who retired in Macon County a number of years ago died in a Huncosbe County hospital last Thursday. He had been in declining health for several years.

He was a member of the Franklin Presbyterian Church and had been an elder in the Edgewood Presbyterian Church of Columbus, Ga., prior to his retirement here.

For 30 years he owned and operated the Superior Foundry in Columbus. A veteran of World War I, he was a member of the Columbus American Legion post.

Services were held Sunday at the Striffer and Hamby Funeral Home chapel in Columbus. Burial followed in the Park Hill Cemetery.

Mr. Hoffmeyer is survived by his wife Mrs. Evelyn Massey Hoffmeyer, of Route 3, Franklin; one son, Charles William Hoffmeyer, of Decatur, Ga.; and one daughter, Mrs. Helen Tippett, of Route 3, Franklin.
