### Fatal To Nine-Year Old Macon Boy

Ted Hoglen, nine-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Everett B. Hoglen, of the Hickory Knoll section of Macon county, died at the Duke hospital, Durham, Sunday morning about 6 o'clock. Death was attributed to a brain tumor.

The boy had been ill at his home for several months prior to entering the hospital.
